
## U of A Cancer Center at Banner – University Medicine North re-accredited for breast care

## **Media Mentions**

For all faculty in the Department of Medicine from Dec. 2 to March 18, there were nearly 140 mentions in the media for research and seasonal issues related to their subspecialties from cardiology to rheumatology. In all, 23 faculty members were associated with these stories.

At the top of the list for Department of Medicine faculty in the news in the last quarter was **Hesham Sadek, MD, PhD**, chief of the Division of Cardiology and

director of the Sarver Heart Center, with more than 36 media outlet pickups, largely associated with two published studies – one on <u>"Common drug shows promise against rare type of heart disease"</u> (Feb. 17, 2025) another on <u>"Can the heart heal itself? New study says it can"</u> (Dec. 20, 2024).

Next with about a dozen media mentions each were PACCS division chief **Sairam Parthasarathy, MD**, regarding a study on how <u>"Peer support could help millions with sleep apnea slumber easier"</u> (Dec. 3, 2024); Hematology & Oncology division chief **Rachna Shroff, MD, MS**, regarding <u>"Clinical trial advances research in treatment of biliary tract cancers"</u> (Jan. 13, 2025), and Hematology & Oncology's **Sara Centuori, PhD**, and **Alejandro Recio Boiles, MD**, who were among co-authors on <u>"Study reveals hope for immunotherapy as prostate cancer treatment"</u> (March 4, 2025).

Dermatology's **Daniel Butler**, **MD**, GGP/Neurology's **Lalitha Madhavan**, **MD**, **PhD**, and Infectious Diseases' **John Galgiani**, **MD**, had about six stories with them mentioned – including one based on a <u>Lancet Regional Health study</u> Dr. Galgiani was co-author on that explores AI and machine learning as a tool to predict when it might be best to stay inside to avoid Valley fever (<u>KJZZ-Radio NPR Phoenix</u>, Feb. 14).

And notable one-offs included PACCS' **Tara Carr**, **MD**, on early onset of allergy season (<u>KGUN9-TV</u>, March 6); Cardiology's **Iniya Rajendran**, **MD**, on improving cardiovascular disease diagnoses for women (<u>KGUN9-TV</u>, Feb. 12); PACCS' **Stuart Quan**, **MD**, **PhD**, on digital cognitive behavioral therapy for chronic insomnia (<u>Frontiers Sleep</u>, Feb. 19); and Nephrology's **Frank "Chip" Brosius**, **MD**, on revised clinical practice guidelines on diabetes, obesity, CVD, and CKD (<u>Cardiovascular Diabetology</u>, Feb. 7).

Notable published papers from the Valley Fever Center for Excellence: Infectious Diseases' Fariba Donovan, MD, PhD, a VFCE researcher, was recently first author on, "Coccidioidomycosis: a growing global concern" (Journal of Antimicrobial Chemotherapy) and "How I Do It: Managing Cavitary Coccidioidomycosis Expert Opinions for Improving Patient Outcomes" (CHEST – among DOM co-authors: Josh Malo, MD, John Galgiani, MD, and Neil Ampel, MD). She also was second author on "Burden of Hospitalization for Coccidioidal Meningitis: An Analysis of the National Inpatient Sample, 2019-2021" (Open Forum Infectious Diseases). These are in addition to a Lancet Regional Health paper noted in Media Mentions above with Dr. Galgiani as an author.
