**About the Presenter:** Helena Yip, MD is an Associate Professor in the Department of Otolaryngology – Head and Neck Surgery at Banner University Medical Center Tucson, where she also serves as the Director of the Voice and Swallowing Center. She obtained her medical degree from the David Geffen School of Medicine at UCLA and residency training in otolaryngology-head and neck surgery at UC Davis. She then completed a Laryngology and Voice Fellowship at Stanford University. Prior to coming to Arizona, Dr. Yip practiced as an otolaryngologist at the Peninsula Medical Clinic in Burlingame,



California. Her clinical interests include laryngology, voice and swallowing disorders, airway stenosis, and laser treatment for early-stage larynx cancers.
