

About the Presenter: Dr. Richard Panush is a professor emeritus of medicine, Division of Rheumatology, Keck School of Medicine at the University of Southern California, Los Angeles. He earned his bachelor's and medical degree at the University of Michigan and completed his internal medicine residency training at Duke University and his fellowship training in rheumatology and clinical immunology at Brigham & Women's Hospital at Harvard Medical School. In 1976, he became chief of the Division of Clinical Immunology, Rheumatology and Allergy at the University of Florida College of Medicine and the affiliated VA Medical Center. In 1989, he left to became Department of Medicine chair and program director at Saint Barnabas Medical Center, Livingston, N.J. There, he also was a professor and vice chair of the Department of Medicine at the University of Medicine and Dentistry – New Jersey Medical School (1989-98) and a professor at Mount Sinai School of Medicine in New York (1999-2008). He accepted an appointment as professor of medicine at USC's Keck School of Medicine in 2010. In 2022, he received the Distinguished Medical Educator Award from the



Association of Program Directors in Internal Medicine and the Alliance for Academic Internal Medicine.
