About the Presenter: An assistant professor of medicine in the Division of Nephrology and Hypertension at Northwestern University's Feinberg School of Medicine, Dr. Shikha Wadhwani is founding director of the college's Glomerular Disease Program and program director for its Advanced Fellowship in Glomerular Diseases. She co-founded the Rheum-Renal Lupus Nephritis clinic to provide interdisciplinary care to patients with kidney involvement due to SLE (Systemic Lupus Erythematosus). Dr. Wadhwani's clinical interest and research focuses on patients with glomerular diseases, vasculitis, and pregnancy-associated kidney disease. She is site principal investigator for the NIH-funded CureGN study (CureGN.org) and several clinical trials for rare autoimmune and inflammatory kidney diseases. Dr. Wadhwani earned her bachelor's degree from Washington University in St. Louis in 2005 and her medical and master's degrees from Chicago's Rush University Medical College in 2010 and 2016 respectively. She completed her residency training in internal medicine (2013) and was a postdoctoral nephrology research fellow (2014) and completed her fellowship training (2016) at Rush University Medical



Center. Afterward, she did an advanced fellowship in glomerular diseases at Ohio State University (2017).
