**About the Presenter:** Dr. Bruce Leff is a professor of medicine at Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine, where he directs the Center for Transformative Geriatric Research. His research focuses on novel models of care delivery for older adults, issues related to multi-morbidity, risk prediction, performance measurement, and quality measurement and improvement – with an emphasis on home and community-based models of care. These include [Hospital at Home](#), or HAH, home-based primary care, [CAPABLE](#) and others. He co-leads the [HaH Users Group](#), which leads technical assistance to foster the scaling of HaH in the U.S. He co-directs the [National Home-Based Primary Care Learning Network](#). He has served on multiple [National Quality Forum](#), [NCQA](#) and Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services Technical Expert Panels. He cares for patients in the acute, ambulatory and home settings, and is an award-winning teacher and mentor. He has been chair of the Geriatric Medicine Board of the American Board of Internal Medicine, chair of the ABIM Council, president of the American Academy of Home Care Physicians, and a member of the American College of Physicians Board of Regents and the Annals of Internal Medicine editorial board. He is a trustee of the ABIM Foundation.
