He is a member of the American Society of Clinical Investigation and the Association of American Physicians. His clinical and research interests and expertise are focused on the care of patients with chronic kidney disease and acute kidney injury. He also has a research interest in nutritional and metabolic aspects of acute and chronic diseases. He is currently an associate editor for Kidney International, and he is the



recipient of the National Kidney Foundation Joel Kopple Award, International Society of Renal Nutrition and Metabolism Thomas Addis Award, and VUSM Excellence in Mentoring Translational Scientist Award.
