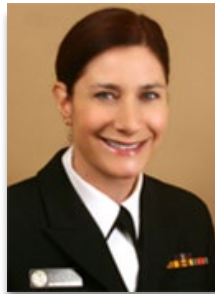

Orion McCotter, MPH, at the Arizona Department of Health Services (2008-14), led its Arizona Border Infectious Disease Surveillance program. As a CDC Mycotic Diseases Branch staff epidemiologist (2014-20), he served as a Valley fever (Cocci) national subject matter expert and set up a national public health workgroup. In 2020, he led development of Oregon’s non-healthcare congregate settings workplan for COVID-19 response. Last year, he began a new state program as public health manager for carceral settings (including prisons, jails and reentry facilities).

Rebecca Sunenshine, MD, FIDSA, is Maricopa County Department of Public Health chief medical officer and a captain in the U.S. Public Health Service. As a CDC Career Epidemiology Field Officer assigned to Arizona since July 2006, she has served at the Arizona Department of Health Services for four years and at MCDPH since 2009. She is trained as an infectious disease epidemiologist with specialty training in internal medicine and infectious diseases at the Oregon Health & Science University followed by the CDC Epidemic Intelligence Service Fellowship in 2006. She has guided MCDPH through many public health emergencies including the 2009 H1N1 pandemic, Zika virus, Ebola virus, Hepatitis A countywide outbreak, and COVID-19 pandemic responses.

Mariel Marlow, PhD, MPH, coordinates justice system-related activities at the CDC National Center for HIV, Viral Hepatitis, STD, and TB Prevention, oversees the center’s Correctional Health Agenda, and serves as NCHHSTP Correctional Health Workgroup co-chair. She joined the CDC in 2015, as an Epidemic Intelligence Service officer in the Division of Foodborne, Waterborne and Environmental Diseases.
